b) The final Greater Sydney Cup points shall be determined by using the total points scored from both Rounds as per the table above.

Round 1 – 11th June, Round 2 – 12th June.

As per Competition Rules, Chapter 5, Rule 4 a), the Driver that accumulates the most points in a Class/Division shall be classified as the "2022 Greater Sydney Cup" Winner.

Trophies will be awarded to the first three highest point scorers in each class. Refer to Section 8.4 if there is a tie on points. The Winner of each class will also be awarded the "2022 NSW State Cup" Black Plate. Points shall only be awarded to the Drivers classified as finishers in all Heats and the Final Race.

Non-finisher's, Non Starter's and Disqualified Competitors will not be awarded points.
