The final series points shall be determined by using the total points scored from the Competitors best two Rounds. A Competitors worst Round (Which can be a non entry) will be dropped.

Prizes will be awarded to the first three highest point scorers in each class.

The winner of each Class will be awarded a "Blue Plate" as State Champion for that Class.



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Points shall only be awarded to the Drivers classified as finishers in the final results of each race. Non-finisher's, Non-Starter's and Disqualified Competitors will not be awarded series points. Any race which is stopped, and not restarted, and where less than 50% of the race distance has been completed by the leader shall be deemed a non-race in respect of series points and no points shall be awarded.

Any race which is stopped, and where 50% or more of the race distance has been completed by the leader, shall be deemed to have finished and full series points shall be awarded.

Series points are allocated to individual Drivers and are not transferable between Drivers.

#### **Series Results When a Tie Exists:**

- a) In the event of two (2) or more Drivers scoring equal points in a Class or Division at the end of the Series, the final Series order will be determined by reference to each Driver's overall placing at the Series Meetings used to determine the Driver's final point score.
- b) The Driver with the greater number of first places in the Class or Division will assume the higher place in the final Series order.
- c) If this fails to break the tie, then the Driver with the greater number of second places in the Class or Division will assume the higher place in the Series order, and so on until the tie is broken.
  - i) If this fails to break the tie, then the final Series order will be determined by reference to each Driver's placing in each race of the Class or Division contested the Series Meetings used to determine the Driver's final point score.
- d) The Driver with the greater number of first places will assume the higher place in the final Series order.
  - i) If this fails to break the tie, then the Driver with the greater number of second places in the Class or Division will assume the higher place in the Series order, and so on until the tie is broken.

3.1.	Pit Crew with trolleys Will Not be given access to the Circuit during Qualifying and Racing.
3.2.	Retrieval of Karts is at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course
3.3.	Pit Crew must only enter the Circuit when permitted by the Grid Marshal or the Clerk of the Course and then only if wearing a <b>HIGH VISIBILITY SAFETY VEST</b> on the upper torso.
3.4.	Karts can be retrieved via the Out grid or as directed by an Official
4.	ADDITIONAL VENUE REQUIREMENTS
4.1.	Subject to any applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, including but not limited to guide dogs, no animals are allowed anywhere within the facility.
4.2.	No dumping of Fuel or Tyres, please make your own arrangements.
4.3.	No unlicenced driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Circuit.
4.4.	No motorised scooters, mini bikes, roller blading, skateboards, bicycles and tricycles allowed at the complex during the entire Meeting. Officials may confiscate any such items for the duration of the Meeting.
4.5.	Marquees are not to be erected without consent of the Club.
4.6.	VISORS - Clear Visors must be provided and used as directed by Officials.
